Most days tours conclude by 3:30, leaving you all afternoon and evening to explore! Better yet, it will be summer in Peru, so pack your bathing suit.

The historic city of **Cusco** sits 12,000 feet up in the Andes. This ancient capital of the Incan empire is an impressive mix of Indian and Spanish cultures. Many buildings have Spanish colonial style buildings erected upon the walls of ancient Incan structures. Quaint narrow streets meander up mountain sides, with stores containing some of the finest weavings, religious arts and paintings available anywhere. Numerous museums and churches house countless works of priceless art. Lots of free time has been built into our schedule in Cusco to allow you to explore the place the Incans called, "The Navel of the Universe."

Machu Picchu, "The Lost City of the Incas", is a four hour train ride through the Andes Mountains away from Cusco. We will spend three days (December 30 to New Year's Day) at a hotel on site.

You will be able to explore the hundreds of structures, thousands of steps, and miles of ancient irrigation terraces, that sat undiscovered in the Peruvian jungle from 1500 to 1911. We will have our New Year's party under the stars where Incan emperors lived 500 years ago.


Lima is a vibrant city of 7 million. We will spend two days in Lima. We will be staying in the fashionable Miraflores district, along the Pacific Ocean. We will take tours of the Pachacamac oracle. We will tour the Gold Museum, an unequaled collection of ancient Indian and colonial riches. We will also take a city tour that includes the Lima cathedral and catacombs that house remains of Spanish and Indian settlers from the 1500s. You will have afternoons free to frequent the handicraft fair, antique shops, and upscale stores throughout Miraflores.


Peru's time is one hour ahead of Houston in the winter.

Saturday, December 27 — Lima city tour in the morning, afternoon visit to the impressive Lima Gold Museum.

Sunday, December 28—Depart Lima arrive in Cusco. Free day of adjustment to altitude. Optional evening Kusikay dance, music and theater spectacular.

Monday, December 29—Cusco city tour including the Cathedral, Q'oricancha (a marvel of pre-Colombian architecture, an Incan temple upon which the Santo Domingo church was built) and Archbishop Museum (one of the finest collections of colonial art in the world). In the afternoon, visit the ancient ceremonial grounds of Sacsaywaman, Q'enko, Puka Pukara, Tambomachay, etc...in the outskirts of Cusco.

Tuesday, December 30— Early morning train ride to town of Aguas Calientes. Tour of Macchu Picchu ruins. Lunch on your own with dinner in the town in the evening.





Wednesday, December 31, 2008-- Day 2 in Aguas Calientes. Return to Machu Picchu, visit Mandor Waterfalls, or try the mineral baths just outside town. New Year's Eve Party overlooking the Urubamba River.

Thursday, January 1, 2009—Short day in Aguas Calientes. Butterfly tour and New Years lunch at the fancy Inka Terra restaurant. Return to Cusco in the afternoon.

Friday, January 2,—FREE DAY in Cusco.

Saturday, January 3— Sacred Valley of the Incas tour, including the ruins at Ollantaytambo, the ruins and huge marketplace in Pisaq, the indigenous village of Chinchero and beautiful Urubamba. a picturesque village in the Sacred Valley.

Sunday, January 4— Return to Lima. Visit the Pachacamac ruins. Shopping at the Jockey Plaza Shopping Center if time permits.
